Spring Vegetable Risotto

Ingredients

1 cup Arborio rice
4 cups vegetable broth
1 cup dry white wine
1 small onion, finely chopped
2 cloves garlic, minced
1 cup peas (fresh or frozen)
1 cup baby spinach
1/2 cup grated Parmesan chees



Fresh herbs (like parsley or basil) for garnish

Instructions:

Salt and pepper to taste

- 1. Heat the broth: In a saucepan, heat the vegetable broth and keep it warm over low heat.
- Sauté the vegetables: In a large pan, heat the olive oil over medium heat. Add the onion and garlic, and sauté until translucent.
- 3. Cook the rice: Add the Arborio rice to the pan and stir to coat with the oil. Cook for about 2 minutes until the rice is lightly toasted.
- 4. Add the wine: Pour in the white wine and stir until it is mostly absorbed by the rice.
- 5. Add the broth: Begin adding the warm vegetable broth, one ladle at a time, stirring frequently. Wait until the broth is mostly absorbed before adding more. Continue this process until the rice is creamy and cooked through, about 18-20 minutes.
- Add the vegetables: When the rice is almost done, stir in the asparagus and peas. Cook for a few more minutes until the vegetables are tender.
- Finish the risotto: Stir in the baby spinach, butter, and Parmesan cheese. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 8. Serve: Garnish with fresh herbs and serve immediately.
